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Preface

The Instructor's Manual features three components to enhance your use of *Academic Vocabulary*: collaborative activities, games, and a test bank.

Collaborative Activities: This section suggests ways to use the Interactive Exercises in pairs, in small groups, or with the whole class. The section also introduces other activities that students can do together. These activities allow students to work with others, use the words in conversational settings, and discover their learning style preferences. Working with others can make students more comfortable with learning and using new words, which will lead to greater motivation to study vocabulary.

Games for Any Chapter: The use of games shows students that learning vocabulary is enjoyable. The games range from group to individual. Some have winners, and some are "just for fun." The instructions explain what equipment is needed and how the games can be played. The games can be used for a single chapter or to review several chapters. Some of the games take advantage of the flash cards the students have made. A few of the games can take a whole class session to play, while others can be played in 15-20 minutes. If there isn't time to play any games in class, and there is student interest in using games as a review method, the instructor can make copies of a game's instructions to give to students so they can play with their friends, classmates, or as part of a study group session.

Test Bank: Three quizzes are provided for each chapter. The quizzes can be used for different semesters or for different sections of the course. There are also two quizzes for each Word Parts chapter and tests for the Review chapters and final exams. The tests are designed so that instructors can give them in various ways: the students can write the words in the blanks, put a letter in a blank space, or use a scan-tron form. Following the Test Bank is an Answer Section for all the exercises and tests in *Academic Vocabulary* and in the Instructor's Manual.

Combining the materials in the text and the Instructor's Manual will help students see that learning vocabulary is not something to dread, but an activity to enjoy.

ALSO AVAILABLE

Academic Vocabulary Web Site: The Web site features additional exercises and tests that allow for even more interaction between the student and the words. The Web site also has an audio component—students can listen to each chapter's thematic reading, and they can hear the pronunciation of each word as many times as they choose.

Collaborative Activities

Activities Using the Interactive Exercises

Collaborative learning gets students talking and leads to congenial classroom experiences that motivate students to attend class. Group projects also help students to meet others they may want to form study groups with, which frequently result in life-long friendships. There are many ways to use the Interactive Exercises for collaborative activities. Suggested activities and chapters for which they may best be suited follow.

Pairs

Students work in pairs to create or share the Interactive Exercise. Students may work better together on some of the more creative topics, such as writing a poem for Chapter 20. The students can also share their individual responses with another person orally or through further writing activities. Writing works especially well with the Interactive Exercises that ask for longer responses (Chapters 2, 8, 10, 20, 25, and 26). For example, in Chapter 8, after reading the partner's program notes, the student can write a letter explaining why he or she would or would not want to attend this show. For Chapter 25, the student can write a note agreeing or disagreeing with the opinions expressed in the partner's critique of the painting. The additional writing projects should also use the chapter's vocabulary words. Favorite correspondences can be shared with the whole class. Pairs can also continue to share opinions related to an Interactive Exercise by using the vocabulary words in a conversation.

Small Groups

Small-group exercises give students a chance to use the words conversationally. Most of the Interactive Exercises work well in groups of four to six. Students can complete the Interactive Exercise in a small group, such as being an advertising-campaign team put together to write the sales pitch for Chapter 26. Small groups can share their answers orally with each other and then pick favorite responses to share with the class. To enhance critical thinking skills, the members of each group can be asked to explain why they made their selections to share with the class. For example, for Chapter 10, students can explain what made the person's journal entry the most interesting, or for Chapter 14, question 1, why they thought the chosen anecdote was the best.

Whole Class

Some of the Interactive Exercises can be done with the whole class participating. For example, for Chapter 7, students can raise their hands (or call out) to give examples for each question. A long list can be created on the board, or a set number (such as six) need to be given before moving on to the next question. The Interactive Exercises done individually can be shared by having students write one or two of their responses to a listing exercise (Chapters 7, 9, 13, 16, 19, 22, and 24) on the board. When several responses are recorded, similar and different answers can be discussed. This activity also works well for the question format exercises (Chapters 1, 3, 4, 14, 15, 21, and 27). Students can answer aloud or be given a question to write a response to on the board. Discussion can follow as a variety of answers are expressed.

Other Activities

The following activities can be used for individual chapters or for review of several chapters. They take advantage of different learning styles by employing art, movement, writing, and group work.

Design a Poster

Equipment needed: pens, colored markers or crayons, and unlined paper (large pieces preferred)

In small groups or individually, students design posters related to the reading topic. The students should use at least five words on the poster as well as draw people or images that will attract the public's attention and get their message across. Share the posters with the rest of the class. Have the class members vote for the most persuasive poster. Possible chapters for using this activity are 4 (announce a hike in the woods), 8, 15, and 25 (advertise a concert, a movie, or an art exhibit), 10, 13, 16, and 22 (advocate preserving or traveling to the area), 19 (promote a political rally), and 26 (advertise a product).

Title the Picture

Equipment needed: unlined and lined paper, pens, and crayons or markers if desired

This activity can be done with the whole class or in groups of four. On a piece of unlined paper, each student (person A) draws a picture of anything and signs his or her name to it. Then the student passes the picture to the person on his or her left (person B). On the lined sheet of paper, person B writes a title for the picture using one or more of the vocabulary words and puts the name of person A next to the title. Then B passes the drawing to the left; it will now be in the hands of person C. C also writes a title on the lined piece of paper, making sure to write the person's name next to the title. To practice several words, participants should use different vocabulary words for each title they write. Person C passes the drawing so person D will have it to give the picture a third title. Because persons B, C, and D have also been passing their drawing to the left, each drawing now has three titles. Hold up one of the pictures, and read the artist's name. Have each person read aloud the title he or she gave the picture. As a group, decide which one best fits the picture. Do the same for the other pictures.

Make Your Own Cloze

Equipment needed: paper and pen

Students write their own cloze using five to ten of the words to be studied. Write the choice of topics on the board or let students pick their own. Remind students that dialogue adds vividness to a story. Exchange stories and see if another person can fill in the blanks. Among the chapters students can refer to for examples of cloze tests are 7 (Self-Test 2) and 8 (Self-Test 2). Possible topics are Meeting New People, A Trip Around the World, A Difficult Class, or A Favorite Movie or Book. This activity reinforces the Hint in Chapter 6 about making your own tests.

Hidden Story

Equipment needed: paper and pens, a board, and chalk or markers

Divide the class into groups of five. Write five words on one side of the board and five on the other side. The groups use the list on their side of the room. Give the class the topic. Each person writes a sentence or two using the first vocabulary word from the list on his or her side of the room. End the final sentence with the last four words on a separate line so the paper can be folded with only the four words showing. These words are the only clue the next person has to what has been written. The second person now writes a sentence or two using the second vocabulary word, and follows the same folding procedure. Go around the circle until all five words have been used. When the first person gets his or her original paper back, unfold it and share the story with the group. The resulting stories should be amusing. The stories also show how important it is for a writer to have an idea of what he or she wants to say to make a clear point. Share the story the group likes best with the class. Students can use other forms of the vocabulary words, such as plurals and past tense.

Possible topics and titles include The Adventures of a College Student, The Critic's Last Word, Staying Fit, or A Person to Admire.

Flash Card Story

Equipment needed: flash cards

Divide the class into groups of five to six people, and give each person one or two flash cards depending on how many words are being reviewed. The group then creates a story using the words. After roughly five minutes, each group presents its story with each person holding up his or her word(s) when it appears in the story. One person can tell the whole story and the others can hold up their flash cards when appropriate, or each person can tell the part of the story that has his or her word(s) in it. The class members vote on the story they like best with people explaining why they made their choice.

Join Me

Equipment needed: flash cards

One person stands in front of the class holding a word and using it in a sentence. For example, if Anthony has the word <u>diligent</u>, he could say, "At this point in the semester, I feel I am a <u>diligent</u> student because I study regularly." He then asks, "Who can join me?" Anyone who can use a vocabulary word and add to Anthony's comment comes forward. Suzi comes up and says, "I am also able to <u>cope</u> with work and school because I too study every night." And she asks anyone to join her. The challenges continue until the whole class surrounds the first person. The group members can decide if they don't think a comment relates to the one before it, and therefore the person should not be allowed to join the others yet. The students can pick their words from any of the vocabulary words to be studied for the session, or they can be limited to picking two or three flash cards to use before the activity begins.

Games for Any Chapter

These games can be used for individual chapters, the review chapters, or for midterm and final review sessions.

Charades

Equipment needed: flash cards

Pick a word from the flash-card pile and show it to a student to act out for the class. Because some students are shy, it helps to divide the class into two teams and have one person from each team come up at the same time and act out the same word. The class can watch both actors to guess the word.

Picture This

Equipment needed: a board, chalk or markers, and flash cards

Divide the class into two teams. One student from each team comes to the board and is shown a flash card of the same word. Both students draw something to represent the word. The two teams try to guess the word, using either drawing for clues.

Hangperson

Equipment needed: a board, chalk or markers, and flash cards

Divide the class into thirds. Draw a gallows on the board. One person comes to the front and picks a card from the flash-card pile. The student draws spaces on the board representing the letters of the word. One person from team one guesses a letter. If the letter is in the word, the student writes it in the appropriate space. Another person from the same team is given a chance to guess a letter. If the letter is not in the word, the student writes the letter on the board and draws a head on the gallows. A person from team two now gets to guess a letter; the team keeps guessing until it misses a letter. Whenever a team misses a letter, draw another body part on the figure. If a team thinks it knows the word and it is the team's turn to guess a letter, it can guess the word instead. If the team is wrong, it loses its turn. If the team is right, it gets a point. The team gets an extra point if it gives the correct definition of the word. The team the drawer came from gets a point if none of the teams guesses the word before a head, a body, two arms, two legs, two eyes, a nose, and a mouth are drawn.

Give an Example

Equipment needed: slips of paper, a bowl or other container, paper and pens

Assign each student a word. The student writes an example of the word on a slip of paper. For instance, if the word is <u>antonym</u>, a student could write "beautiful/ugly." The student puts his or her name and the assigned word on the other side of the slip. Put all of the slips into a bowl or other container. Each student numbers a sheet of paper 1 to 15. Pull out one of the examples, and read it to the class. The students put the word they think the example shows next to number 1 on their sheets. Continue on through number 15. Then return to the slips and tell what word each slip illustrates. If there is some confusion, ask the person who wrote the slip to explain his or her example. The person with the most correct answers wins. If slips remain, use more than 15 numbers on the sheets or play two rounds.

Six Guesses

Equipment needed: flash cards

Divide the class in half. Arrange two sets of desks facing each other at the front of the room. Invite two people from each team to sit in the desks. Show one person from each team a flash card. Pick a team to go first. The person who saw the word gives the other person a one-word clue to get him or her to guess the word. For example, if the word was <u>prioritize</u>, the person might say, "order." If the person guesses the word with one clue, the team gets six points. If the person doesn't guess the correct word, the next team gives a one-word clue. This time the clue might be "importance." If the team guesses the word, it gets five points. Continue the rotation of giving one-word clues and lowering the point value until a team gets the word, or there aren't any points left. If no one gets the word, tell what the word was and review its definition. Then call up another set of four, and start with a new word.

Fit the Discipline

Equipment needed: flash cards, a Word List, or the Glossary

Give a student a flash card or a word and the name of a discipline or subject, and ask him or her to create a sentence or two that connects the word to the discipline. For example, if Elaine gets <u>access</u> and <u>chemistry</u>, she could say, "By studying <u>chemistry</u>, we have <u>access</u> to information that could do away with diseases."

Possible disciplines: administration of justice, anthropology, art, astronomy, biology, business, chemistry, composition, computer science, drama, education, engineering, environmental science, film, French, geography, geology, history, literature, mathematics, music, nursing, physical education, political science, psychology, sociology, Spanish, speech, urban planning, zoology

Opposites

Equipment needed: none (flash cards, a Word List, or the Glossary can be used for reference)

Divide the class in half and stand the students against facing walls. One team is the positive side and the other the negative side. Take turns starting with positive and negative comments. If the negative side starts, the first person in line makes a negative statement using one of the vocabulary words to be studied, for example: "I abhor doing homework." Someone on the positive side has to make a statement showing an opposite point of view and use a vocabulary word. The statements can be imaginative. For example, "I feel revitalized after I finish my homework, so I always look forward to doing it." If the class agrees that the statements show opposite views, then both people sit down. If the statement doesn't work, someone else from the opposing side can try to make a statement. After three tries if no one makes an opposite statement, the game proceeds to the next person in line who makes a new statement. Any students left standing after everyone has had a chance to make a statement are dubbed the least contrary people in the class.

Word Race

Equipment needed: word list with definitions, a board, and chalk or markers

This is a good game to revive a sluggish class or involve kinesthetic learners. Pull out three people and then divide the class in half. The group of three acts as judges. The other two groups can be given names based on two of the vocabulary words to be studied, such as <u>fauna</u> and <u>flora</u> for Chapter 4. The fauna team lines up on one side of the room and flora on the other, facing the board (the desks made need to be pushed back for this game). Give a definition of a word, and the first person on each team runs to write the word on the board. The judges (standing at the side of the room) yell out "good studying" if the word is right or "study harder" if the answer is wrong, or use other phrases agreed upon by the class. Each team has one chance to write the word on the board. A team gets a point if the word is right. One of the judges writes the scores on the board.

Bingo

Equipment needed: Bingo sheets, flash cards, and markers (pennies work well)

Photocopy the Bingo sheet. The students bring in the flash cards for the chapters to be studied. After shuffling the flash cards, each student picks 25 random words and writes those on the card (24 words if there is a free middle space). They also need 24 or 25 markers. The instructor reads a definition. When students think a definition fits one of their words, they cover the word with the marker. A student yells "Bingo!" when he or she has a line across, down, or diagonal. The instructor goes over the definitions and marked words to make sure the "Bingo" is valid.

At Random

Equipment needed: flash cards

Put the students in small groups (about six people). One person picks a flash card from the pile and says a random word. The person then calls on a group member to make a connection between the vocabulary word and the random word. For example, Matt selects the word <u>declare</u> and says, "<u>pumpkin</u>." He then calls on Colleen, who replies, "I <u>declare</u> that <u>pumpkin</u> is my favorite kind of pie, especially with whipped cream on it." The person gets a point if the group agrees that the sentence makes sense using the two words. Pass the flash cards to the person on the right. Play until everyone has been called on three times. Reshuffle the cards after they have been gone through once. The person with the most points wins.

At Random in a Sack

Equipment needed: one large paper sack or several small ones (for small-group play), a variety of objects, and flash cards

Instead of using random words, ask the students to bring in objects. The instructor may want to provide additional objects. Put the objects in a sack (as many as will comfortably fit). Without looking inside, one student reaches into the sack and pulls out an object. The student also picks the top vocabulary word from the flash-card stack. The person then connects the object and the word. For example, if Gerry pulls out a <u>bell</u> and gets the word <u>allot</u>, he could say, "I am going to <u>allot</u> two hours to study for my history test, and I will ask my brother to ring a <u>bell</u> when my time is up." The person gets a point if the connection makes sense. Another person then takes a turn.

Give Me a Clue

Equipment needed: paper and pens

Divide the class into small groups and give each group three words. The group writes three examples for each word. One group then goes to the front of the class and gives its first clue for a word. The spokesperson for each team raises a hand if the team thinks it knows the word. If the team gets it right on the first guess, that team and the clue-making team get 20 points and another team comes to the front. If no one gets it right, go to the second clue. On the second clue both teams get 15 points, and on the third clue the teams get 10 points. If no one gets it right after the third clue, tell what the word was and no one gets any points. Move on to another team's clues. If there is time, all the teams will present three words. The team with the highest score at the end wins.

If the word was <u>blunder</u>, a team's clues (examples) could be taking the lid off a blender while it is on, oversleeping on the day of an exam, and losing the phone number of someone you liked at a party.
